

REDS' GREATEST CLUTCH MOMENTS OF THE DECADE

70 TOP MOMENTS OF THE 1970'S

The Reds won 167 spring and summer games since Coaches Danley and Ervin started coaching in 1972 throughout the remainder of the 1970's, despite playing far fewer summer games than the Reds have in decades since. That included 86 league wins and 4 postseason wins, including 1 State Tournament win.

Some of these victories were by significant margins (for example, the Reds 10-ran 39 of their opponents) and the Reds' average score in victories was 10-4 throughout the decade. But many of the games were close (51 of the victories were within 2 runs, 34 of which were decided by a single run), especially late in the season when it mattered most. These games required late-inning heroics, including 24 games where the Reds had to come back from deficits in the last couple of innings to win. The Reds' season was at times down to its final strike, but the Reds came through to mount heroic victories.

Even a number of the games that ended in the Reds' favor by a comfortable margin were only decided after the Reds had "that one inning", where the Reds scored 5 to 12 runs to put away an otherwise tight ballgame. A number of comebacks and late-inning heroics in summer league games have been eliminated from below to showcase only the Reds' Top 70 clutch moments of the decade. Of the 70 games listed below, the Reds trailed 24 times (sometimes by as many as 5 to 10 runs), were tied late in the game another 27 times, and had to hold onto 1 or 2 runs leads in nearly all of the other games listed below.

Note: In spring games throughout the 1970's, the Reds played in a limited District Tournament with only the top 4 teams qualifying and had to win the District Semifinal game in order to be one of the 8 or 16 teams to qualify for State, and then played a single-elimination tournament from there. The Reds did not qualify for the State Tournament in the summer during this decade, but did finish in the top two teams in league to qualify for the double-elimination District Tournament in 1979. Below are the results from games that were in doubt late or that had the Reds trailing by many runs at any point. Scorebooks have not been preserved in seasons prior to 1972, and thus those game details are excluded from below.

Rick McClure and Jack Cazer then both singled, and with two outs, Mark Nelson drew a walk, Mike Eldridge drew a bases-loaded walk, Tim Kawakami reached base and Strong hit a grand slam to cap off the inning as the Reds took an 8-0 lead. After two runs had scored, Donahoo then induced a bases-loaded flyout to rightfielder Gary Takahashi to end the scoring threat. In the bottom half of the inning, Rick McClure singled, Jack Cazer singled, Marty Damrell reached on a fielder's choice, Nelson singled, and Eldridge and Kawakami singled to increase the lead to 11-2. Then after the first two batters scored in the top of the 6 th inning, Donahoo retired the next 3 batters in order to preserve the 11-4 lead. Donahoo then ended the game by retiring 3 of 4 batters in the top of the 7 th inning.

Don Donahoo then singled, and Rick McClure and Mike Eldridge hit RBI singles as the Reds took a 5-run lead. Strong then allowed a runner on base, but then after a fielder's choice led to an out at 2 nd base, a line drive was caught by first baseman Jack Cazer who then raced to 1 st base in time for the inning-ending double play. In the top of the 6 th inning, Strong walked, stole 2 nd and 3 rd bases, and scored on a wild pitch to give the Reds a 7-1 lead. Strong then stranded two runners on base in a scoreless 6 th inning, before McClure added a run in the top of the 7 th inning after reaching 2 nd base on an error and then scoring on a single from Eldridge . Strong then struck out the first batter in the bottom of the 7 th inning, and then after a walk, caught a line drive that he turned for a game-ending double play.

Strong then struck out the next batter and induced a flyout to leftfielder Doug Schnorr to end the top of the 6 th inning. Strong then retired 3 of 4 batters in the 7 th inning, ending the game with a strikeout.
4	4/18/72	Platte Valley	League Game	Bot. of 5 th Inning Reds Trail by 3	Trailing by 3 runs with only 9 outs remaining, Don Donahoo led off the bottom of the 5 th inning reaching base and scoring on a double steal as Mike Eldridge walked and took 2 nd base, Doug Stroberg then singled and then with two outs, Randy Vogel walked, Rick McClure singled, Tim Kawakami reached base, and Steve Strong hit a home run as the Reds took a 4-run lead after stealing a remarkable total of 10 bases in the inning. After the first two batters in the top of the 6 th inning reached base, Steve Strong induced a groundout to shortstop Marty Damrell and then catcher Eldridge threw out two consecutive runners trying to steal 3 rd base to end the inning. Eldridge then singled and scored before Jack Cazer singled and scored on a single from Damrell who then scored on a 2-out single from McClure to take a commanding 12-5 lead. Strong then recorded a strikeout and fielded two groundouts himself to end the game.

Jack Cazer then pitched 4 straight scoreless innings, allowing just 3 hits as the Reds added an insurance run in the 4 th inning and then 3 more runs in the 5 th inning. Cazer struck out the side in order in the 7 th inning after having stranded 2-3 runners on base in each of the 4 th -6 th innings, ending those innings with strikeouts.

Don Donahoo then tripled and scored on an error on the throw to 3 rd base to cut the deficit to 1 run. Rick McClure then walked and scored on singles from Doug Stroberg and Mark Nelson to tie the game. Then in the top of the 7 th inning with the bases loaded and one out, third baseman Rick Goering jumped to snag a high hopper and step on 3 rd base and then throw home to complete the inning-ending double play as catcher Eldridge applied the tag at the plate. Then after Jack Cazer pitched a scoreless top of the 8 th inning and stranded runners on 2 nd and 3 rd base, and then retired the side in order in the 9 th inning, Bill Riegel singled in the bottom half of the inning, before being out at 2 nd base on a fielder's choice that put Cazer on first base. After having lost a chance at a perfect game in the 5 th inning after a 3-2 pitch was called a ball for the walk, Cazer then hit a batter in the 6 th inning, but had otherwise been perfect. In the 7 th inning, he induced a groundout that he fielded himself for the first out. He then induced a groundout to first baseman Marty Damrell for the second out. Then on a 1-2 pitch, Cazer struck out the next batter to complete the no-hitter.

Eldridge then stranded runners on 1 st and 3 rd base in the top of the 4 th inning after recording a strikeout for the 2 nd out and then fielding a comebacker to end the inning. Rick McClure then led off the Reds' half of the inning with a single, Stroberg walked, and Eldridge hit a 3-run home run for his 2 nd home run in as many innings. Jack Cazer then doubled and scored on a single from Randy Vogel to extend the lead to 7-0. Eldridge then retired the side in order in the 5 th inning, and again in the top of the 6 th inning. Steve Donahoo then retired 3 of 4 batters in the 5 th inning. Marty Damrell then hit a solo home run for an insurance run in the top of the 6 th inning, before Donahoo retired 3 of 4 batters to end the bottom half of the inning. Then in the 7 th inning, Donahoo recorded a leadoff out, and then after a double, second baseman Hoffner caught a line drive and threw to shortstop Dan Knight in time for the game-ending double play.

Schneider then retired 3 of 4 batters in the bottom of the 5 th inning at which point the game was called due to the rain.
17	4/9/74	Weld Central	Non-League Game	Extra Innings Tied Game	In the only game in Eaton history in which the Reds were initially ruled to have lost, before their protest was upheld with the game replayed from that point, the Reds were in the top of the 10 th inning with one out and runners on 2 nd and 3 rd base when shortstop Dan Knight was interfered with while fielding a groundball. That runner heading to 3 rd base was correctly ruled out, but the runner from 3 rd base was originally allowed to score the go-ahead run. Coach Danley argued the call and then officially protested it, before the Reds went on to be retired in the bottom of the 10 th inning for the apparent loss. However, the league commissioner correctly upheld the protest and had the game completed days later at a neutral site. This time, with the go-ahead run taken off the scoreboard and moved back to 3 rd base, Jack Cazer took the mound and induced a flyout to end the top of the 10 th inning in a tie. Then in the 11 th inning, Bob Beets relieved and retired the side in order. In the bottom of the 11 th inning, Rick Goering led off with a single, and then advanced to 2 nd base on a bunt from Doug Stroberg . Beets then walked, and then with two outs, Knight hit a groundball to the second baseman that was misplayed to knock in the game-winning run.
